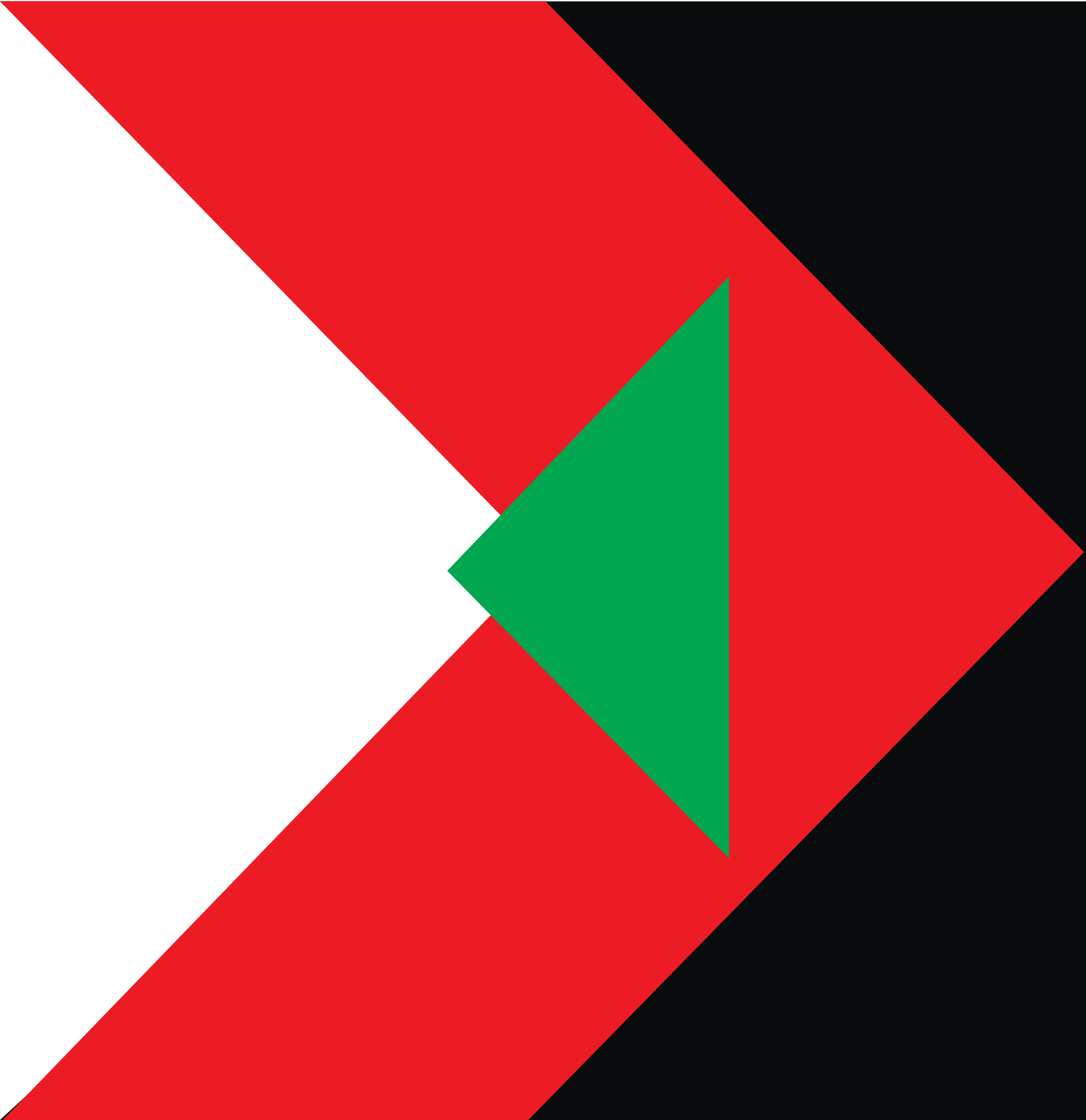


THINK LOCAL GO GLOBAL

Eligibility

Students of Fashion Photography and Hair & Make up artistry are also invited to submit their applications for the JD Annual Design awards 2020.

Duration

JD Annual Design awards 2020 is open for a duration of six months from November 2019 to April 2020. The process of JDADA 2020 will culminate in a Fashion event and design fest scheduled for the first week of May 2020.

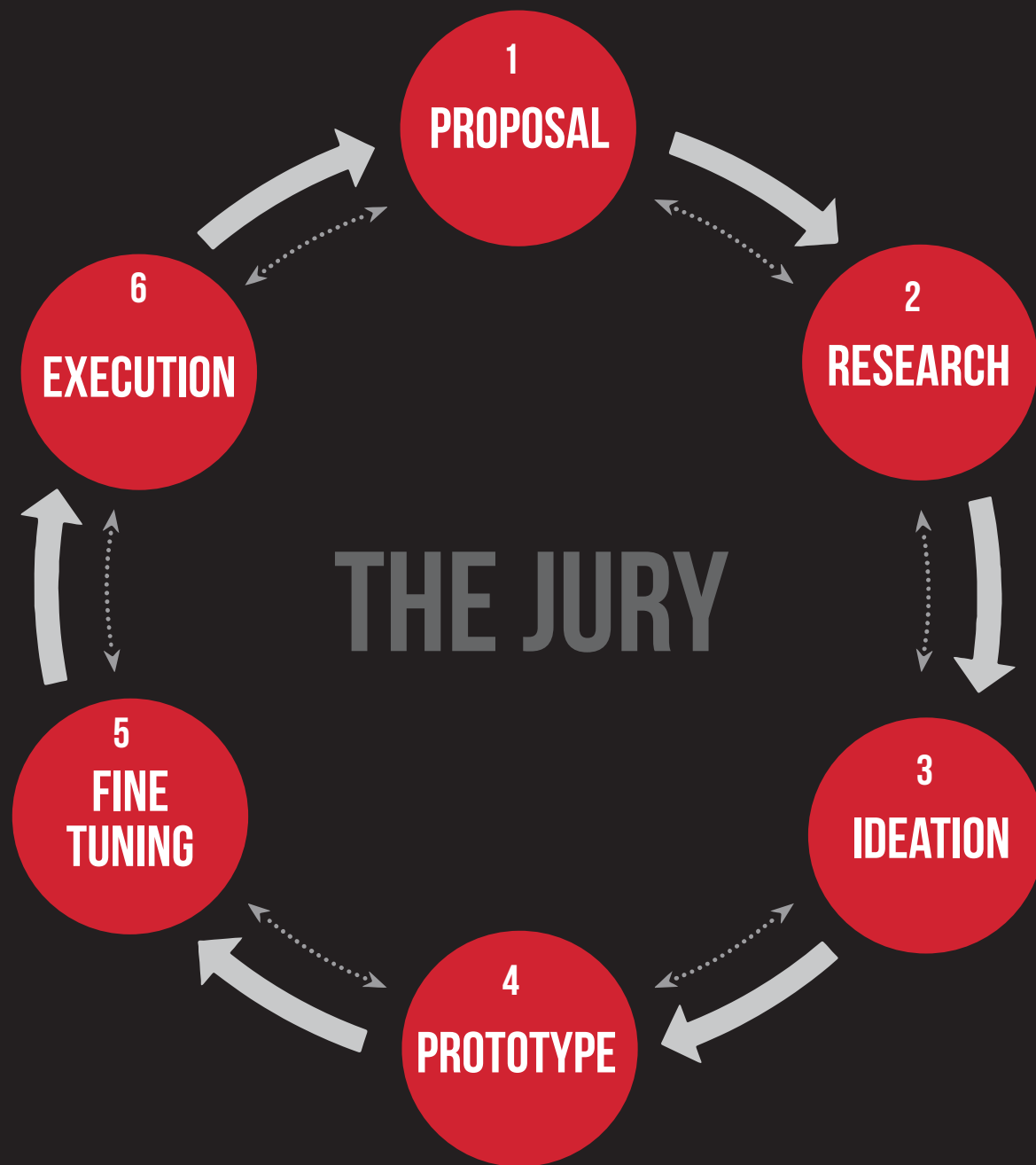

The chosen mentor shall be available to the teams based on a first come basis. Please note that the subject experts are made available to the teams/Individuals for guidance and opinions, however the decisions regarding the project and its details will have to be taken finally by the teams/Individuals in consultation with the experts.
